## **Hygiene Kit content** (NEW items in original packaging)

1 adult-size toothbrush (in manufacturer's packaging)

1 large bar bath soap (leave in wrapper)

1 nail clipper (good quality)

1 hand towel (medium weight, dark or bright colors. approx. 16 in x 26 in)

1 wide-toothed comb (6–8 in)

**Relief Kits** - These kits are larger and more expensive to collect, but are also needed. They would be a good project for Sunday school classes or small groups. Relief kit lists are also on the bulletin board. Pack all items into a box, label it "Relief Kit", and place it near the kit collection area. We will get it to MCC where the items will be placed into a new 5 gallon plastic pail with a lid.
