Racial Justice Ministry update: The Jubilee Fund committee approved a \$1,000 Jubilee Fund contribution to the Ann Arbor (MI) Shalom Community Church Reparative Act, which is designed to make a grant to a group led by longtime leader within the Mennonite Church, John Powell, to use as it sees fit. The fund was intentionally designed to allow African-Americans to determine the use of the funds rather than having a primarily white group of donors specify uses of the money. Anyone who wishes to add to FMC's gift may make a contribution through the church fund, labeled "Reparative Act." Gifts should be made by May 15. Additionally, the RJM will hold a meeting on May 17 at 7 p.m., when Gary Wetherill will talk about what is known about the native peoples who lived in or close to Bluffton prior to white settlements in the region, and will talk about the small remnants of tribes in Ohio who were not forced to move west in what is often called "the second trail of tears."
