The purpose of the meeting is to elect a slate of nominees to serve in the Leadership Circle as described in the revised FMC constitution and to approve a spending plan for the first six months of the coming fiscal year. Copies of the annual report and accompanying spending plan are available in the fellowship hall.**

**Delivery of our order** of the new *Voices Together Hymnal* has been delayed by Covid-related temporary shutdowns at the publishing facilities. MennoMedia has not yet provided a delivery date, but when our hymnals arrive, we will notify those who ordered personal copies through First Mennonite.

**Today's organ selections** are based on Advent hymns with historical significance in Christian hymnody. The music of the prelude, *Savior of the Nations, Come*, is based on plainsong found in manuscript from the 12th century. Its original Latin text is attributed to Ambrose of Milan (4th century.) Refer to HWB 173 for an English translation. Composer Andreas N. Vetter's 17th century setting states the melody of the hymn's first phrase 8 times in imitative style. The text of the Offertory, *Comfort, Comfort Ye My People*, is based on Isaiah 40: 1-5. The hymn text addresses not only our anticipation of Advent, but also the importance of preparing ourselves for the season. Refer to HWB 176. The tune and text of today's postlude, *O Lord, How Shall I Meet You*, are rooted in the 17th century Lutheran tradition. Composer Johann Crüger wrote the tune specifically for Paul Gerhardt's German text. The text of stanza 3 joyfully anticipates the Lord's arrival: "You come, O Lord, with gladness, in mercy and goodwill to bring an end to sadness and bid our fears be still. In patient expectation, we live for that great day when your renewed creation your glory shall display." The organ setting by contemporary Lutheran composer Kenneth Kosche intersperses the hymn tune's 4 phrases with buoyant, energetic music.
