Eastertide 2020

In Eastertide we join those who walked with Jesus before his death, as he reveals himself after his resurrection. In a locked room, walking and talking, breaking bread, fishing, one minute he's there, and the next, he's gone again. Certainly a time of joy and delight, it is also a time of confusion, wonder, lingering grief and questioning. It is in this time that Jesus seeks out his friends. Ruth Haley Barton writes, "As our resurrected Lord, Jesus' first order of business was to seek out his now-dispersed disciples to meet them in their emptiness outside the tomb, to walk with them on the road between the now and not-yet, to create space to repair what had been lost and broken, and to find a way in through the locked doors of their fear and doubt. Because experiencing the resurrection doesn't happen overnight. Some resurrections take time. And those are no less miraculous."

May we be found by Jesus this Eastertide. May we be found in the stories of Jesus' seeking and finding his friends. May we be found among the suffering, and alongside those who doubt at table and along the way.

Divina, which means "divine reading." This relatively simple method invites you to listen to Scripture with the ears of your heart, allowing the text to serve as an entry point to conversation with God. Often taught side by side with Centering Prayer, *Lectio Divina* includes space for reading, reflection, response and rest in the word of God. *Taste and See has decided to continue to meet. Specific topics have not yet been identified, but the class may focus on practicing prayer forms already discussed. All are welcome.*
