FMC's Reopening Task Force has developed a comprehensive guide for present and future gatherings throughout the Covid-19 pandemic. Two documents have been developed. The first is a spreadsheet outlining our planned response to the various levels in the Ohio Public Health Advisory System. The second is a more detailed explanation of what appears in the spreadsheet. These guidelines follow the alert levels and accompanying distancing guidelines used by the state of Ohio, and are based on what we know now. As new information emerges about the virus and as new treatments and vaccines become available, the guidelines may be revised. The two documents were distributed to church members earlier this week and may be accessed on the website at www.fmc@fmcbluffton.org. Click on the "Reopening Guidelines" tab at the top of the home page, then follow the links on that page. Paper copies will be available in the literature rack in the fellowship hall.
