Update from Steve and Janet, 03-29-16 – Frequently asked questions

Q: How is Steve doing?

A: Steve is currently able to eat a liquid diet, supplemented with high protein drinks. He walks each day, as part of his surgery rehab, and to build his strength for the heart transplant. There are good days and days that are more challenging. Steve spends most of the morning each day completing his rehab, being monitored, etc.

Q: Has Steve been moved up on the heart transplant list?

A: It's complicated. Steve is high on the priority list for a heart transplant. However, he has not yet sufficiently recovered from the total heart pump surgery.

Q: How long will Steve need to have the total artificial heart pump?

A: We don't know. Although he is high on the priority list there are several factors that will impact the time he will need to wait. First, he must regain strength from the pump surgery, and his other organs need to recover. Second, the heart transplant requires a matching process. Finally, there is no way to tell when a heart that matches will become available.

Q: Is the complete artificial heart pump powered internally?

A: The pump is implanted in Steve's chest, but there are tubes that run to an external power source that runs the pump.

Q: When will Steve be returning home?

A: We don't know the answer to that question. However, it seems clear at this point that Steve won't be returning home in the near future, and he won't return home until after the heart transplant

Q: Is Steve allowed visitors at this time?

A: Visits are not encouraged at this time, in an effort to conserve Steve's strength and to allow him to concentrate his energies on healing and recovery.
