Some primary Anabaptist convictions then and now are following Jesus Christ in service to others, rejection of violence and war, and joyful community life.

He holds a master's degree in education and lives in San Antonio with his wife Cyndi and children Andre-A and Alex. He is a member of San Antonio Mennonite Church.

Hygiene Kit Contents – Only NEW items, in original packaging

- 1 adult-size toothbrush (in manufacturer's packaging)
- 1 large bar bath soap (leave in wrapper)
- 1 nail clipper (good quality)
- 1 hand towel (medium weight, dark or bright colors; approx. 16 in x 26 in)
- 1 wide-toothed comb (6–8 in)

Please limit your generosity to the items listed. Bags and content lists are on the table and bulletin board near the church library. We also need bag fabric and people to sew bags. Sewing directions are on the kit card in the kit collection area of fellowship hall. Some precut bags and cords are also there. *Relief Kits: These kits are larger and more expensive to complete, but are also desperately needed. They would be a good project for Sunday school classes or small groups. Relief kit lists are also on the bulletin board. Just pack all items into a box, label it "Relief Kit," and place in the quilt room. We will send these to MCC where the items will be placed into a new plastic pail with a lid.
