In response to local immigration actions, the Mission Peace and Service Commission invites all to consider bringing donations to worship on Sunday, Aug. 5. The most urgent need is for food (rice, dried beans, tortillas and other nonperishables,) laundry detergent, sanitary napkins, toothpaste, shampoo, body soap, and larger diapers (size 4-6.) Items will be distributed through local organizations to families of those who remain in detention or have been deported.

- Sanctuary painting is complete!
- Ongoing: Pew and chair cleaning and renewal
- July 16: Construction of steps and railings began
- August 6-19: Hardwood flooring put in (front of sanctuary floor and stage area), sanding and clear coating of wood floor under and in balcony
- August 20-25 or 31: Carpet installed and new rubber stairs by Church St. door

Jonatan Moser and friends will host a fundraising meal July 29 in the assembly room to support his work with Mennonite Voluntary Service. Jonatan will serve with MVS in Alamosa, CO, from August 2018–August 2019 as an immigrant assistant case worker and English teacher at the local Immigrant Resource Center. The population is a blend of traditional Latino and Anglo settlers, plus newer immigrants from Mexico and Guatemala.
