Conscientious Objector discussion: Consider joining a CO conversation Sunday evening at 7 p.m. in the sanctuary. Perry Bush will facilitate the conversation about conscientious objector status and military draft registration. We are holding this with junior high and senior high youth in mind, both male and female, and their parents, but it is also open to the congregation and friends of FMC.

The conversation will open with some history of the CO status and the considerations of choosing to register as a CO. We'll also review Article 22 on Peace, Justice, and Nonresistance from the Confession of Faith regarding the church's official position, discuss how to register and what kinds of documentation to include in CO files, as well as how the church family can support youth. The meeting, which will last about one hour, will include a presentation and question and answer period.
