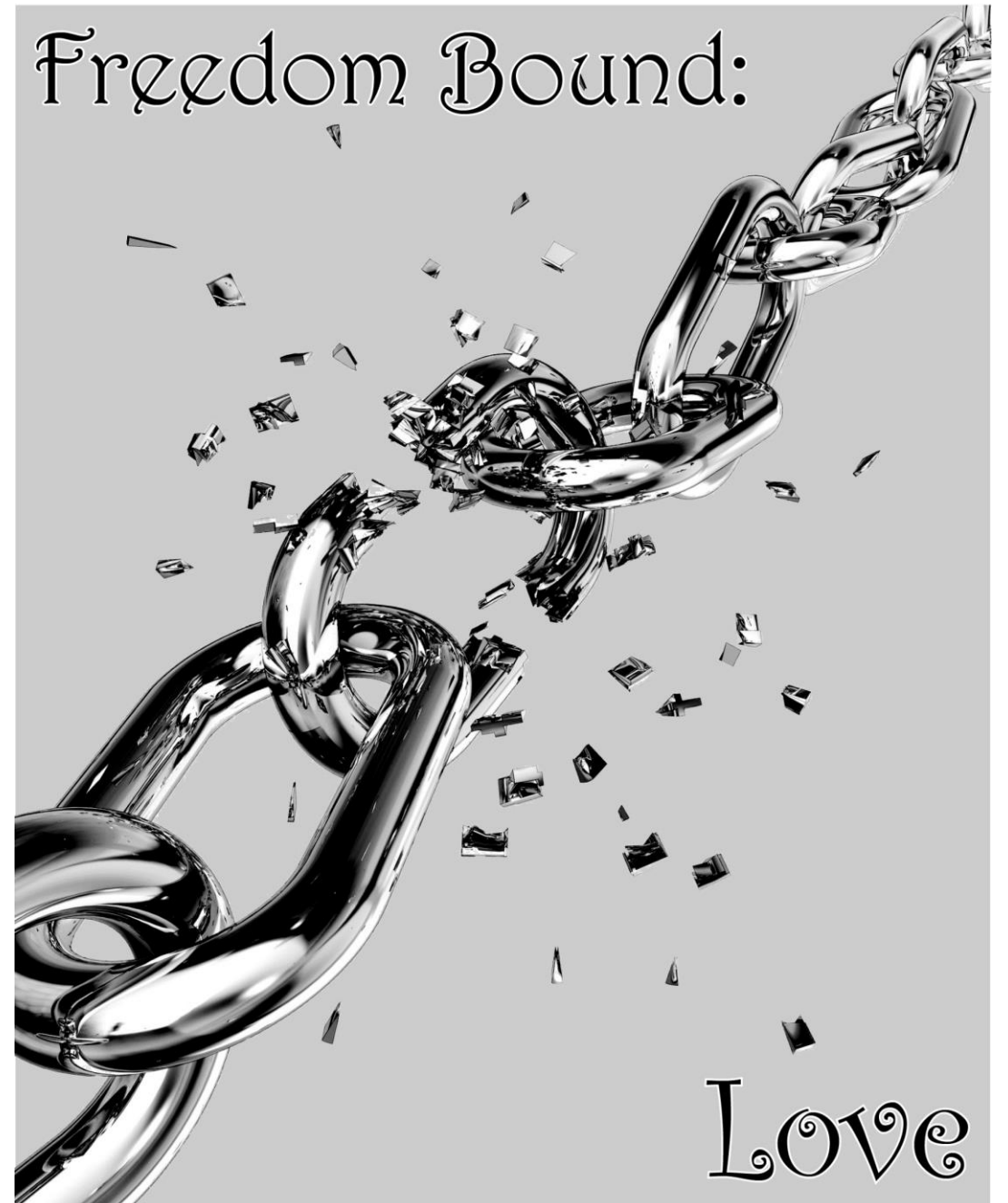

**Brazo en Brazo** is now in its 12<sup>th</sup> year. An agenda to be embraced by our supporting congregations is to nurture and encourage a vision for active involvement in Brazo en Brazo ministries. *(The following is an excerpt from the annual report. You'll find the full report on the Mission, Peace and Service pillar in the fellowship hall.)*

"Immigration is a reality for Lima, Allen and surrounding counties as in many areas of Ohio and the USA. Laborers and professionals are coming from Spanish-speaking countries. For these adults, Spanish is the "soul" language. The children will rapidly learn English. This means there is a need for Christian services in Spanish and needs for tutoring school-age children and English classes for adults... congregations can prepare their people to receive and welcome these immigrants by encouraging study of the Spanish language. They can create a welcoming environment by occasionally singing a Spanish song with a familiar tune. Creatively reaching out to families and individuals will develop relationships that lead to trust..." -- Paul and Ann Conrad
