\$\$ Financial Update \$\$ - We've closed out the books for 2022. The **good news** is that we finished in the black. **More good news** is that giving exceeded the Spending Plan by 10%, which was an increase of 4.4% in giving from 2021. This increase offset the extra expenditures not originally anticipated in the 2022 Spending Plan: organ repair, the sound upgrade, and cosmetic and repair upgrades to our building. If giving remains consistent, we should be on track for 2023, barring any major unplanned expenses. A graphic summary will be in your mailbox prior to a financial review on **May 3 at 7 p.m.** in the **Fellowship Hall.**

2023 Spending Plan Update: At the end of February, spending exceeded giving by \$5,814. This is not unusual at this point in the year. Overall, our giving for 2023 is exceeding giving in 2022 by approximately 20%. In the future, quarterly updates will be provided in the bulletin, and the monthly reports will be posted in the Fellowship Hall. Expect the next financial update in April after the 1st quarter is complete.

Delegates wanted! The Central District Conference Annual Meeting is slated for June 22-24 at Goshen College, College Mennonite Church. We can send 10 delegates, and we currently have 7 lined up. If you have interest in being a delegate or want to learn more about it, contact Pastor Phil or Pastor Carrie.

Mennonite Home Communities of Ohio Service Group will hold a **BBQ Chicken** fundraiser **April 29**. Proceeds will support purchase of outdoor furniture for the MMH Memory Care Area (Sycamore Gardens.) Composite furniture will include a table and 6 chairs. The cost will be approximately \$3,000. BBQ tickets are **\$10 each** and may be purchased through April 17 at the MMH front desk from 8:30- 11:00 am and 12:00-4:00 pm or from Gloria Hernandez Bucher. Curbside meal pickup will be Saturday, April 29, from 4-6pm at Bubba C BBQ, 158 Jackson Street, Bluffton. Thank you for your support.

The Honduran Mennonite Church owns a small retreat center near Lake Yojoja named Finca Diakonia (Discipleship Farm), and is appealing for help in repairing, painting, and re-roofing the existing buildings. They are suggesting that small groups would arrive on Saturdays, go to church at our Sister Church in Colonia Lopez on Sunday, work Monday through Friday, and leave for home on the following Saturday. As well as daily work at the retreat center, workers will be treated to the famous Baked Tilapia fish dinners at Lake Yojoja, and tours of local Honduran sites.
