The Mutual Aid Fund continues to be a significant way FMC lives into our priority of Following Jesus by supporting our church family, community members, and international connections. From January to mid-September, we have made 35 disbursements of food or payments to 23 individuals/families. Two of those were immigrant/international families, 5 were FMC members or family of members, and 16 individuals or households were from the community. Groceries and housing continue to be the most significant need. FMC distributes \$30 Community Market gift cards and food items from the little free pantry next to the church office. This pantry works in conjunction with the Bluffton Food Pantry by offering a place for



people to pick up items in between the scheduled distribution times of the food pantry housed in St. John's UCC. Grocery donations are always welcome, in particular Chef Boyardee items and cans with pull-tabs. This summer, Ray Person and Elizabeth Kelly began donating cartons of eggs to be distributed to people, as well.
