The military draft may feel irrelevant today, a thing in our distant past. However, in the fall of 2021, The U.S. House Armed Services Committee voted to expand registration for the Selective Service System, commonly known as the draft, to include women, a move that brings the requirement one step closer to becoming law. As part of the debate on the fiscal 2022 defense policy bill, committee members voted 35-24 to require all Americans ages 18 to 24 to register for the draft, not just men. Air Force veteran Rep. Chrissy Houlahan, D-Pa., proposed the measure, saying the current system is unconstitutional because it discriminates based on gender.

Current news includes Ukraine's consideration of lowering their draft age from 27 to 25 years old. Globally, young people are still concerned about the draft.

FMC equips youth and family with information and recommendations in preparation of registering when youth turn 18, including building a CO file which the church maintains for years. Join a CO (conscientious objector)conversation this afternoon, Apr. 21, at 4 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall. During the conversation, Ryan DeMarco will share his

personal experience with the military, and peace packets will be distributed and reviewed. This conversation is planned with youth and their families in mind but anyone with interest is invited to attend.
