# **CELEBRATING!**

FIRST Night originated at FMC in 2004. This intergenerational Wednesday evening event promised food, fun, and fellowship around the table for all ages. From Oct. 6 - Nov. 17, the church was abuzz with activity. In the January 2005 Annual Report, then Church Moderator Mitch Kingsley wrote, "FIRST Night proved simply delightful. Large chunks of the congregation gathered...to eat and share and have fun across generational lines. Let's do this some more."

Indeed, just months later, the 2<sup>nd</sup> series of FIRST Night ran from Jan. 26 - Mar. 16. The event was something the whole

church got behind. Trustee Commission Minutes from Nov. 2, 2004 included notes that their commission had "purchased a new freezer and provided funds for various items to help with this Wednesday night program." At its height, attendance at the event ranged from 170-200 and included a waiting list. Mary Amstutz and Barb Stettler organized the meal portion including Cooks, Table setters, and Clean-up crews, which was no small task. In its first run, 49 people offered hospitality through these meals. More people were involved in collecting sign-ups and money on Sunday mornings, offering their faith stories before the meal, and emceeing the after dinner activities. Over the years, FIRST Night went through various changes including price increases (\$4 for an individual and \$12 for a family) and a shift toward a more adult-focused after-dinner presentation. Cooking teams and clean-up crews became difficult to secure. After 9 ½ years, Mary & Barb invited new leadership, ideas, and energy as they stepped back. FIRST Night concluded with the Fall 2014 season.
